Minutes of Escapees Chapter 29 Carolina Rovers

2014 Fall Rally, September 26, 2014, 5:00pm – 6:00pm Mayberry Campground, Mt. Airy, NC

President, Steve Masterson called the meeting to order, welcomed members and guests, introduced new members, officers present and Volunteer Chapter Representatives Tom and Mary Ann O'Brian and Sue Spahn.

PRESIDENTS REPORT – The chapter membership fluctuates between 45 and 55 rigs. We are sound financially and due to funds collected at the Spring Rally and not spent, the cost of this rally to attendees would be zero.

SECRETARY'S REPORT – Marie Rickenbach read the minutes from the meeting at the 2014 Spring meeting. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes. The motion was passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Terri Wirtz confirmed that we are sound financially. The ending balance in our check book is \$993.42. There are some debits such as shipping for shirts and patches and \$178.80 designated to send to CARE that will be deducted from this as well as bills from this, 2014 Fall rally. Our Bank account has been changed from a business account to a personal account to avoid \$12.00 per month charges for accounts with less than \$1500.00. Terri reminded members that they must be a member of Escapees before they could be a member of Chapter 29. A motion was made and seconded to accept the treasurer's report. The motion was passed.

President Steve Masterson explained CARE (Continuing Assistance for Retired Escapees) to new members and reported that we had 23 rigs, 43 people including 6 new members and 5 guests attending the 2014 fall rally.

VCR Report - Tom and Mary Ann reported that the latest Escapee number was 119069. Escapees has about 65,000 – 70,000 active members. There is also a golden age membership available to members 72 and older who no longer travel for \$14.95 per year. Golden Age members must pay non-member fees for camping at Escapee campgrounds. There is also a veteran's discount of 5% available; a copy of your DD-214 needs to be provided to Escapees. More information can be obtained at www.escapees.com/veterans. Tom and Mary Ann thanked Steve and our rally masters.

New Business -

- 1. Escapade will be March 8 13, 2015 in Tucson AZ. If no one is attending we need to find out if we can have flyers for Chapter 29 on a table for distribution. (After the meeting, Mary and Andy Brown volunteered to staff the ROW.)
- 2. Chapter 29 2015 Spring Rally will be held April 11-14, 2015 at River Plantation RV Resort, 1004 Parkway, Sevierville, TN 37862 http://rvcoutdoors.com/river-plantation/ We have reserved 30 sites for the Chapter 29 rally. Members need to make their reservations directly with the campground and tell the campground

they are with Escapees Chapter 29 so they will be assigned campsites with our group. They also need to confirm with the campground that they will (or will not) be staying for SKP ACRE so they will not have to move. Campground rates are \$30.50 (plus tax) for the Chapter 29 rally – the same rate as SKP ACRE. Sue and Jack Brinker, Dave Young and Helen Thompkins will be Rally Masters.

- 2015 SKP ACRE (All Chapters Rally East) will be at River Plantation RV Resort (see info above) April 15-21, 2015. Members need to make their own reservations with the Campground. Please remember to tell them your are attending the SKP ACRE and want to park with SKP Chapter 29. For more information on SKP ACRE go to http://skpacre.com
- 4. Chapter 29 2015 Fall Rally. Rally Master Keith and Carol Martin. It has been presented to have the rally at Willow Tree RV Resort in Longs, NC (37 miles NE of Myrtle Beach). Other venues were discussed. Norman Lowrance will look at other venues and rates next week. Norman will share this information with the Officers to determine next steps. We are looking for a campground with rates less than \$35.00 per night.
- 5. Chapter 29 2016 Spring Rally we need volunteers for rally masters. No one volunteered.
- Chapter 29 elections Spring 2015 Vice President and Treasurer will be up for election.
 Kaye Heins has indicated she will not run for reelection. Terri Wirtz has indicated she will
 run for reelection.
- 7. Chapter 29 Financial Review a 3 member committee was selected to conduct the review. They are Craig Rickenbach, Barb Homer and John Martin with Bob Seaver acting as an alternate. Craig will be chair the committee and schedule the review.
- 8. A change in collecting dues was discussed. A plan was suggested to pay for 3 years and get the 4th year. It was decided to keep the current plan of \$5.00 per year with the opportunity to pay for more than one year at a time.
- 9. It was mentioned that our goal with rally fees is keep them below \$10.00 per person and as close as possible to the actual cost.
- 10. Name tags. Steve Masterson will post all resources for obtaining name tags on our website. Three major sources for obtaining nametags were mentioned.

During past rallies we have realized what talented cooks we have in our chapter. In future newsletters we would like to share recipes, particularly those that are easy to fix and cook in an RV environment. Since this is the first newsletter in a while and we didn't have time to ask for submissions, I will use two of the recipes we enjoyed last week. Stay tuned for more goodies in future issues.

Goulash

Ingredients:

1 1/2 pounds ground beef or turkey - browned

1 small onion, diced

1 small bell pepper diced

4 large mushrooms, diced

1 pound macaroni

1 (8.75 oz.) can whole kernel corn drained

1 (14.5 oz. can crushed tomatoes

4 (6 oz. cans tomato paste

Mix all ingredients in large pot. Simmer 20 to 25 minutes.

2 (15 oz.) cans tomato sauce

24 fluid ounces water

1 tablespoon chopped garlic

1 tablespoon grated parmesan cheese

dried parsley

1 teaspoon white sugar

1 teaspoon olive oil if using turkey

Swedish Meatballs

Ingredients for meatballs:

1 lb. ground beef

1/2 cup bread

1/3 cup minced onion

1/4 cup milk

1 egg

1 tablespoon parsley

1 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon black pepper

1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire Sauce

1/4 cup shortening

Ingredients for sauce:

1 - 8 oz. jar grape jelly

1 - 8 oz. jar chili sauce

Mix meatball ingredients, roll into 1" balls and brown in shortening. Place meatballs in crock pot and add grape jelly and chile sauce. Recipe may be doubled to fill crock pot.
