
### Tennessee-Georgia-North Carolina: April/May 2015

After attending the Chapter 29 and ACRE rallies in Sevierville, we headed south to Chattanooga, TN. When

we made reservations at Raccoon Mountain RV Park, we were told they only had one site left because of the "Corn Bread Festival" being held in Pittsburg, TN, that week. Although there were full hookups, our site was on the side of a hill and was sparsely covered with gravel. As we had a lot of rain while there, our site was somewhat of a mud hole. We thoroughly enjoyed the area and visited



Lookout Mountain, downtown Chattanooga , with its many good restaurants, The Hunter



Festival. Pittsburg, TN, is about 25 miles from Chattanooga just off I-24. The main street

was blocked off for several blocks and the streets were filled with craft and food vendors (including several selling samples of different types of corn bread) as well as entertainers. Pittsburg is also the home of the Lodge Iron works, so we had to visit their company store......didn't realize all the different type of cooking stuff they make.



We left Chattanooga and headed south to Stone Mountain, GA, and camped at the Stone Mountain RV Park.



We had a beautiful site facing the lake. This park is a little pricy, but is a first class facility. We were planning to tour downtown Atlanta while there, but decided not to fight the traffic in the city. At Stone Mountain Park, we visited the museums and an old reconstructed community inside the park, took the tram ride up the face of the mountain, and the next day even climbed up the northern face of the mountain, albeit with several rest stops on

the way. One day we drove into Decatur to see the

Dekalb Farmers' Market. It is the largest farmers' market we have ever seen, the size of two football fields. There were aisles & aisles of produce, wines, meats, fish and shellfish, rice, flour, beans, etc., etc. from all over the world. They had every imaginable type of spice, pastas, sauces, oils, vinegars, wines, teas, etc. I counted six types of snapper, as well as meat cuts, fruits and vegetables I have never seen before.





From there, you looked directly down the fairway across the lake to the face of Stone Mountain...a beautiful hole.

Next, we drove north to the River Vista RV Resort in Dillard, GA, where we will be holding our spring 2016 Chapter 29 Rally. This is a first class resort and the management is very nice and responsive. While in Dillard, we drove up to Highlands, NC. We walked the pretty little town, visiting the many nice shops, and had a wonderful crab cake Caesar salad (no breading in the crab cake). On the way up to Highlands, we checked out a beautiful development around a golf course in Sky Valley. We also checked out a couple of the area waterfalls....There are numerous beautiful waterfalls in the northern mountains of Georgia. Another day we drove 40 miles southwest to Helen, GA, a quaint old German



settlement. We checked out their shops and had lunch at the Old Heidelberg Inn. We shared a brat sampler



platter with hot pickled red cabbage and German potato salad. Of course we each had to have a half liter of good German beer to wash it all down. On our last night went to the Dillard Inn for their Friday night seafood buffet. It was pricey (\$29pp), but excellent. By the way, did we tell you we like to eat? ©

Our next stop was Hendersonville, NC. We camped at the Jaymar Travel Park. We have stayed here before and it is very nice. Surprisingly, we ran into former Chapter 29 members, Ken & Jean Peterson, who are staying there for the season. On Mother's Day, I took Carol to the NC State Theatre in Flat Rock where we saw a Broadway cast

perform a Patsy Cline musical....excellent! After the show, we drove into downtown Hendersonville for dinner.

Our last major stop was Tom Johnson's Rally Park for a NC State WIT rally. On one "free" day, we drove west to the little town of Black Mountain, another quaint little gem in NC. There are many shops and eateries to enjoy. On the way home from Marion we stayed overnight at Raleigh Oaks RV Park in Fair Oaks, NC. As it is the site for our fall 2015 chapter rally, we wanted to check it out. The owner is very accommodating and the park is very clean, with a nice rally room. The Martins and the Martins, Co-Rally Masters, plan to meet there sometime this summer to check out the area for activities and restaurants.

The thing we both liked about this trip was that it was not a long trip (approx. 1,300 miles), we didn't drive a long distance between stops, and we stayed at each place long enough to enjoy the area and have some catch-up time.

#### (Excerpts from Jon & Mary's BC trip)

<u>Exploring BC in early Spring</u> - Why wait until June to see British Columbia. To avoid the tourist crowds, mosquitoes, and black flies, a we decided to see BC in early May. Even though many Provincial Parks and RV campgrounds were closed, the early Spring scenery and overall hospitality were worth it.

We traveled from 4/11 - 5/24 covering 9,400 miles. Below is a map showing where we went in British Columbia plus a few photos.

We crossed into Canada on 4/22/15 in Eureka, MT, meandering slowly through BC, traveling 100 to 200 miles per day. Our original plans were to hit the major tourist cities, however, these plans quickly changed as we talked to locals who suggested other scenic routes. For example, locals in Creston, BC suggested that we drive north, along the shore of Kootenay Lake and take a free ferry across to continue our plan trip to Osoyoos. We liked the drive and ferry so much we decided to continue north via a logging road (where we saw a black bear) to a second free ferry. From the map you can see we continued this style of wandering and exploring.

Where did we stay? We mostly tried to find low cost/free forest type spots for a few days and then a "regular" campground for a night. Even then we choose unpowered sites to save money if they offered it. The extra cost of a "regular" campground provided a hot shower and dump station. Several towns also offer free dump sites. Only a few places did we stay more than one night with our average cost about \$20 Canadian/night.

A high point in our adventure was a 22-hour ferry trip from Port Hardy to Prince Rupert. There were only about 200 people on board. We had an outside cabin for sleeping and Mary got an afternoon tea party because it was Mother's Day. The one challenge was backing up my rig the whole length of the ship as it only had a rear entry.

After getting my Ford F-350 serviced in Dawson Creek, BC, we began our long, rapid trip home via northern Alberta and Saskatchewan - returning to the U.S. via Williston, ND - the heart of the ND oil boom.

Even though the trip was long and tiring, it was the type I enjoy. I am already planning a similar 2016 trip.

## Tech Tips Managing Your Passwords

Many articles have been written about changing your passwords to foil thieves. According to these articles, many people use simple passwords because they are afraid they will forget or because they can't think of any. But passwords are easy to remember when you use ones that are special to you. Don't use your children or grandchildren's names or current pets, especially if you mention them frequently on social media or keep photos on the desk or your computer.

But how about favorite books, or movies, or music artists? For example, say your favorite books are the Harry Potter series. There are a wealth of passwords acquired there: "Harrypotter7&" "Harry +Hermione" "lamamuggles" "Mugglesareus". Simple, right?

What if you love Springsteen or country songs? Pick one song and shorten it, write it backwards, add the year you first heard it. So many simple variations come that you could just change it frequently and still remember it.

If you really like a particular password, say, the names of your two grandchildren, write both the names backward and add today's month and year. When you change it, you just keep changing the month and year. Put the month and year in front of the name or in the middle. "YdnaM?2005" "Nathan8/15boy"

Do you like gardening? What big plant did you put in this year? How is your hydrangea or Queen Elizabeth rose doing? "BeautifulQErose2015" "EndlessSummer??"

I have used pet names with capitals and birth years in various combinations. Even if someone knew the names of all my cats over my lifetime, it is unlikely that they would be able to guess all the combinations available. I keep it simple to remember by using only a few variations and access the files frequently. For less used files, I keep a list of the passwords in a secure but easily accessible location.

Additionally, do not use the same password for all of your financial, legal, and medical accounts. You could use a one for your bank accounts, another for loan accounts, another for credit cards, another for your medical records. Then if someone does find out one of your passwords, they are limited in the files they can access. Use a special one to password-protect your computer so that when you open your computer, you must log in every time and that includes every time it goes to sleep and you must waken it. I have two computers and I use separate, very different passwords for each.

This is not a failsafe protection for hackers. They can still get at your information in outside sources, as has been shown in the news with stores and even the federal government. But using good passwords can help eliminate hacking into your own personal files and every little bit helps.

### How to Sell (or maybe not) your RV

.....and now, for the rest of the story....... We started advertising our Class C immediately after our trip to Sevierville, TN, in April. After cleaning it up and taking some GREAT pictures (at least in our opinion), we posted it on Craigslist, RVT.com and Face Book local "For Sale" areas. Our ritual every morning was to get up and drive it 8 miles north on Hwy #8 at the Interstate 85 junction for better visibility (returning it home each evening). Patience has never been one of our virtues, however, we were getting a lot of inquiries and knew it was only a matter of time before the right person came along. And it happened this past Monday, June 29. We received a call at 7 a.m. from someone whose first sentence was "I have \$20,000 in cash. How much more do I need to get to buy your RV?" (no name, no introduction, nothing!). She and her husband had seen it on the side of Hwy #8 and saw the pictures on Craigslist. After quickly negotiating our price she said she hoped we wouldn't sell it in the next three days and hung up. We guickly dismissed this as yet another weird call and never expected to hear from her again. At 2:30 p.m she called back, said "I'm Dixie and I have all of the money in cash"... and shoved the phone at her husband (still no husband's name or introductions except for her first name). We spent the next hour looking at each other in bewilderment - wondering if this was real. We met them at 3:00 pm at the RV, unlocked the door, let them in and they immediately came out and were going to exchange the money right then and there - on the side of the road. We, instead, guided them to our bank two blocks away to exchange the money there. The wife, her mother (who had advanced alzheimer's) remained in the car outside of the bank with the air conditioning running. The husband only went out to tell his wife he needed her signature - and she promptly left her mother and dogs in the running car to come into the bank. I could only imagine her mother reaching over the front seat and putting the car in Drive and ending up in the bank lobby - Thank goodness that didn't happen. The husband put a wad of money like I've only seen in movies on the teller's window - all in 100's, 20's and 10's. We asked them several times if they didn't want to test drive it or go through the systems and the answer was always "No - we don't need to drive it now." So the money was exchanged, the title signed and notarized, and then we were off to the DMV. Steve was STILL driving the RV because the husband STILL did not want to drive it yet. At the DMV, we turned in our plates, titled it in the new owner's name and I cancelled the insurance on it while in the parking lot. So, the entire transaction from start to finish only took eight hours and they STILL never drove it until they left the DMV parking lot. The lady at the bank was amazed and said it was the strangest transaction she had seen in a while. The last we saw of our RV was heading out of the DMV parking lot, husband driving with one dog and wife, her mother and the other dog following in their car. May they have a long and happy life and many happy camping days!

Since our last newsletter, the Development Team went a little NUTS and dropped some major new features on the site...


