Alaska 2015 - Trip to the Arctic

June 22, 2015, eighty days and about 4700 miles after leaving Appling, Georgia, Aspen and I entered Alaska. The border of Alaska is about 1,000 miles on the Alaska Highway from Dawson Creek, BC.

The drive to the Arctic Circle was one of many “bucket list” items I hoped to accomplish while in Alaska. I chose July 4, 2015 as the day of travel, assuming truck traffic would be relatively light. It was! For those planning a trip to Arctic Circle, realize there are no services, no cell phone services and lot of 18 wheeler traffic – it is their road. Have either a satellite phone or CB radio for the trip in case of emergency.

The Arctic Circle trip on the Dalton Highway (the Haul Road) is the only road access to Alaska's North Slope. The road starts at Mile 0, 90 miles north of Fairbanks, and ends at Dead Horse near the Arctic Ocean. The Haul Road was the featured road for several seasons on The History Channel's show Ice Road Truckers.

The Dalton highway, which directly parallels the Alaska pipeline, is one of the most isolated roads in the United States. About one-third of the 414 miles are paved.

Yukon River Camp-Mile 56- There are only three towns along the route: Coldfoot (pop 10) at Mile 175, Wiseman (pop 22) at Mile 188, and Deadhorse (25 permanent residents) at the end of the highway at Mile 414. Fuel is available at the Yukon River Bridge (Mile 56), as well as Coldfoot and Deadhorse. Two other settlements, Prospect Creek and Galbraith Lake, are uninhabited except for seasonal residents.

July 4, 2015, 4:30PM.

Seven hours and 200 miles from Fairbanks.



Driving the Dalton Highway is one of my fondest memories of Alaska.

My trip to Alaska was the trip of a lifetime. Before I started on the trip I told everyone "one and done." It is a long, hard trip but well worth the time and the scenery is indescribably majestic. Although cut four weeks short due to the death of Aspen I still travelled 11,000 miles in 150 days through six Canadian Provinces and a large number of U.S. states from Appling, Georgia to Seward, Alaska to Virginia Beach, Virginia.

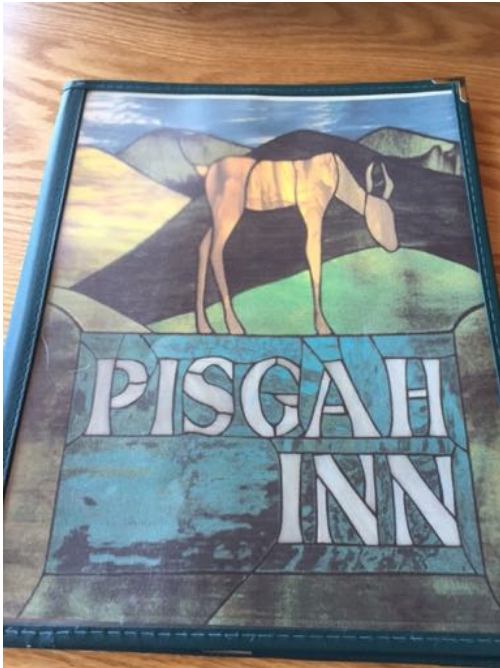

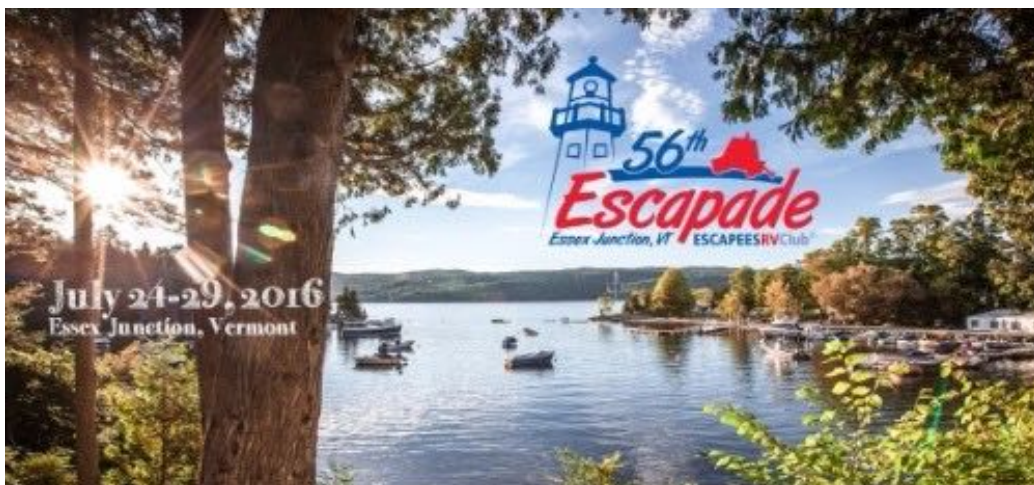
Destination Vermont for the 56th Escapade

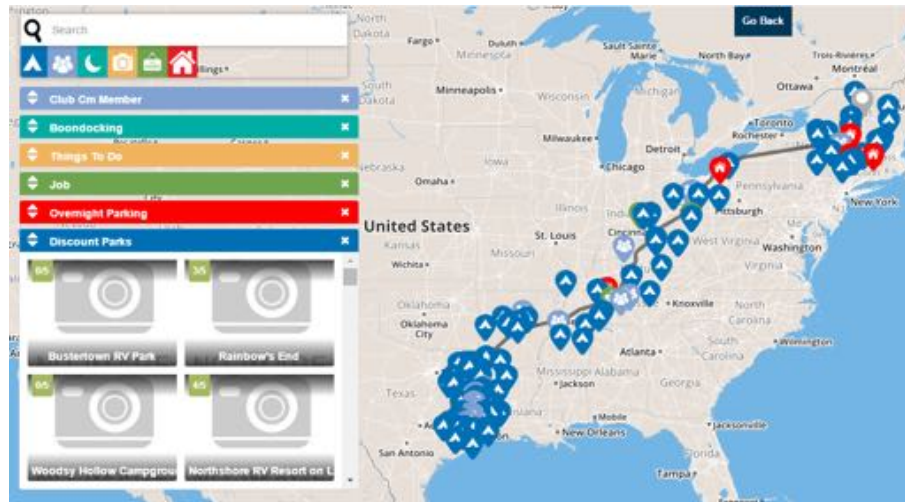
