Greetings to all with hopes everyone is well,

The Fall Rally at Pine Ridge Campground in Roebuck, SC was a tremendous success. Many thanks to John Heenan, Rally Host, and to the company he works for who donated the fabulous breakfast donuts from the Netherlands. Sixteen rigs registered for the Rally and five new rigs joined Chapter 29. We had two campfires, lots of good food and conversation, new friends made and old ones renewed. It really was a great rally. The theme at our covered dish dinner was Western and the Spangenberg's, new members, brought cowboy hats and scarves for everyone to wear. Dinner was capped off with an excellent cake to celebrate the Chapter 29's 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary after being restarted in 2011. Due to circumstances, other than covid, only one original restarter could attend our celebration which was Jim & Linda Jackson. Jim was our first Newsletter Editor. Hopefully the chapter can celebrate 20 years in 2031.

One item discussed in the Officers meeting concerns 4 large plastic boxes that Rally Hosts have been carrying between rallies. These contain accumulated STUFF such as salt/pepper packs, packages of condiments, utensils etc. from past rallies. This has become cumbersome for next rally hosts to transport from the current rally, home then back to next rally. The Officers decided to donate a majority of the items to a local charity. Steve and Dianne Wood took care of donating items to Macedonia United Methodist Church Food Pantry to be used for meal preparations and their food pantry for the needy.

Another item discussed at Officers Meeting held before Fall Rally was Rally Hosts. I have asked in several past newsletters for volunteers to come forward to be Rally Hosts and Officers. To date, no one has volunteered. Due to the shortage of volunteers, the officers have decided starting with the Spring 2022 Rally, the chapter will hold "No Host Rallies" until further notice. There would not be a formal agenda except for having a chapter meeting and planned social hour. During the rally if someone wants to recommend an activity like covered dish or dinner out, the members present shall decide what to do. Update: after the Fall Rally, a singles member has stepped up to be Host of Spring 2022 Rally in Dillard, GA. We prefer to have Co-Hosts so need another rig to volunteer. Fall Rally 2022 is open for Hosts to be held in Myrtle Beach.

Getting members to volunteer to be an Officer is another significant issue for the chapter. If this trend continues, the officers may consider suspending activity until members step forward. Please, Please step up. This is your chapter and we need you. Chapter 1, the original Escapees chapter, folded last year, chapter 30 folded 2 years ago, New York chapter folded. Why you ask, NO volunteers for Officers. Georgia chapter went into hibernation for same reason but has since attempted a restart but are again struggling to obtain volunteers. These are not difficult jobs.

Election of Officers, per Bylaws, are held during Spring Rallies. Since covid has caused us to cancel the last two spring rallies the result is that all positions are up for election. Normally it is President/Secretary on even number years and Vice President/Treasurer on odd number years. Term of office is two years but can be re-elected. To get back in sync some positions may be for one year or three years. Barb Alexander helped Terri Wirtz during registration and was training with Terri for potentially following in Terri's footsteps as our next treasurer. # Members Meeting October 1, 2021 Fall Rally, Pine Ridge Campground, Roebuck, SC

Chapter meeting was called to order at 9:39 by Craig Rickenbach, chapter president. Craig then led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

Elected officers present were Craig Rickenbach, President and Terri Wirtz, Treasurer. Not present was Michael Tasto, Vice President.

Appointed officers present were Dianne Wood, communications director and Steve Wood, rally coordinator. Not present was Steve Masterson officer at large, and Helen Young our sunshine lady.

We welcomed new members:

We had 16 rigs that paid rally fee.

Marie Rickenbach read the minutes of the last members meeting, October 2020. The minutes were approved as read.

Treasurer's report – The beginning balance was \$1,646.28. \$120.00 was collected last night for rally fees. Since the last rally, a total of \$115.00 was for dues. We have 37 paid up rigs for 2021 and 4 people present have not paid 2021 dues which would bring the total to 41 rigs. Chapter 29 usually has 40-50 rigs registered. We have taken in \$119,50 for Tee shirts and it appears we need to order more. Terri will check with the person who made our shirts as he may or may not be making them post covid. The current balance is \$2,000.78 however there are no receipts for this rally. Terri explained our need to maintain \$500.00 in our account to avoid bank fees. She also explained why checks need to be made payable to Terri Wirtz and not Chapter 29 or Escapees. Terri commented that we need to pare down our account balance, in other words we need to spend some money! The membership voted to accept the treasurer's report.

Rally Coordinator, Steve Wood, reported he would appreciate suggestions for campgrounds for future rallies. We have reserved 30 campsites for the Spring Rally, April 28-May 1, at Dillard, Ga. And the rates will be \$50-55.00 per night depending on the number of rigs attending. PLEASE tell the campground you are with the Chapter 29 Carolina Rovers when making your reservation. This will not only mean you will be more likely to be parked near others in the chapter, but it may make a difference in how much all of us pay for our campsites.

The fall 2022 rally will be at Hideaway Resort in Myrtle Beach, SC. The rates will be about \$45.00 + tax (Myrtle Beach has a high occupancy tax!). The dates are October 6-9, 2022. We need volunteers for rally hosts, and the criteria for a rally host is on our website.

### Members Meeting October 1, 2021 (cont'd)

Newsletter Editor, Dianne Wood explained the members directory will be updated after the rally and available to members only. The newsletter is published quarterly and anyone wishing to send pictures or article should do so soon as the newsletter will be published later this month.

Old Business - none

New Business The officers conducted their meeting by zoom this week so all officers could participate. Normally the officers meeting is conducted on Thursday of the rally.

The rallies at River Vista in Dillard, Georgia and Hideaway in Myrtle Beach, SC were mentioned. For more information, see the newsletter.

Chapter 29 donated boxes of equipment and condiments to Macedonia United Methodist Church to be used for meal preparation and their food pantry. Moving these boxes had become a storage problem for chapter members who volunteered as rally hosts.

Chapter 29 NEEDS volunteers to be Officers and Rally Hosts. Chapter 1, the very first Escapees chapter, folded last year due to lack of volunteers. Chapter 30 folded 2 years ago due to lack of volunteers. The New York chapter folded due to lack of volunteers. The Georgia chapter had gone into hibernation, due to lack of volunteers. However has since restarted but is struggling to obtain volunteers. We will be having elections at the Spring Rally, please consider volunteering and talk to a current officer. The criteria for all positions is on our website.

Barb Alexander is training with Terri Wirtz potentially for the position of treasurer.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:45.





#### Post-Script May-April 2021 Adventures With My RV by Linda Stevens SKP #114064

As mentioned in a previous newsletter, I bought a "new to me" 2012 Winnebago Vista in March, 2021, in Iowa. The Winnebago is 8 ft. shorter than my 38 ft. Dutch Star. Yes, indeed, size matters - I know you're smiling! That signaled the start of my learning curve on the way home from Iowa. 30 amps vs. 50 amps, gas vs. diesel.
